

## **ANALYSIS OF P.7 LEAVERS TO SECONDARY SCHOOL by Head teacher, Moses Wangwe ,April 2014**

Greetings from King's Primary School, Uganda.

Here is a report on one aspect of the achievements of King's Primary School, Bunambutye, Uganda, founded and maintained by Ezra UK.

Here is an observation that, as a force for human rights, social change, and a most vital element for combating poverty, empowering and safe guarding children from sexual exploitation, hazardous labor and protecting the environment, education was the only way to bring peace security and hope to this area of Bunambutye.

According to various source of information, Bunambutye's strategy for female education was established in relation to their culture, which obliged parents to uphold the needs and interests of boys' above these of girls' education, owing to lack of resources.

They would prefer girls to be discontinued from school thinking that girls have their places in performing kitchen duties and being locked up at home for subsistence duties. But this report has revealed that king's primary school under Ezra ministry has broken such phenomenas of involving children in nondevelopmental activities like charcoal burning, fish mongering and child labor in Maize fields. When I compare the students I saw in 2007 with this year 2014, I see a tremendous change in as far as statistics in number and the urge for secondary education in our pupils, being highly motivated.

The above analysis shows that many girls are at secondary school level now as compared to previous years which is a very big boost to female children in this area.

Out of the above given statistics, over 120 students are all still in school and their performance is really promising. We have about 20 students who are sit for their O LEVEL course examination this year and within three years' time, the majority of them will be qualified personnel able to

earn their living. This achievement will generate hope in very many families and Bunambutye will be redeemed.

Silas, a former pupil of King's PS was run over and left for dead. He was recovered and ended up in a wheelchair. He has now fully recovered and is walking and back at school. The report from his secondary school stated that owing to the good foundation he had at King's PS, he has now caught up on all the months he missed at school and is doing very well.



Another boy from a poor family was also doing so well that the teachers decided that he would no longer have to pay for school meals. They would pay for his food between them.

We acknowledge the support given towards the educational welfare of this school from all donor friends that God has touched.
